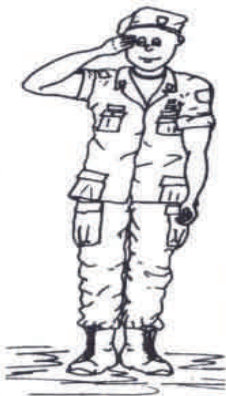

Sunday, January 29—Faith. Academics. Service: In Our Parish: Childrens' Mass 8:00 a.m. Mass. All students need to attend. Student will serve as acolytes, lectors, cantors, choir, and ushers. Mass is followed by the "Big Country Breakfast" Serving begins at 8:30 a.m.

Monday, January 30—Faith. Academics. Service: In Our Community and Nation. Mayor Keith Durham and representatives from his office will read a proclamation, proclaiming Catholic Schools Week in Lawrenceburg (9:00 a.m.) Each Class will write letters to various community, state, and/or national leaders or agencies thanking them for their service. We will also begin our Service Project for our military men and women overseas. We will fill special "care" packages with items for them. This project runs from Jan. 30th to Feb. 29th. Tuesday, January 31—Faith. Academics. Service: All Schools Mass at Cathedral in Nashville All 7th grade students will be attending: Pre-K-6 and 8th grade will focus on health and movement. Wear your favorite sports jersey and jeans. Bring a can of soup to support local food banks.

Wednesday, February 1—Faith. Academics. Service: In Our Students: Pajama Day, Students, wear your warm winter pajamas, (absolutely no night gowns). Students will have a variety of fun activities. Please bring in socks, gloves, mittens or stocking caps, to share with those children in our community that may not have the warmth and comfort that we are blessed with.

**Thursday, February 2—Faith. Academics. Service: In Our Vocations: Sundaes with Father (Joseph). Students pick a vocation or career, and dress for that vocation or career.
